







That mission statement totally and completely embodies my belief in what Scouting is all about. I know that if you take a few moments to think about it you'll realize that it totally and completely embodies your aims and desires for the Scouting program in our children and their children's lives. It is why I emailed Council last year and told them I wanted to help. I really did not know what I wanted to do. I've been a Den leader, WEBELOS Leader, Asst Scout Master and Scout Master. That was around the 75th anniversary "Diamond Jubilee of the BSA." I came back just in time for the 100th anniversary of Scouting. I became a Unit Commissioner and then District Commissioner. I've found the one position in scouting that enables me to have the greatest impact on the lives of more people than any other. Along with this ability to have such a great impact on so many lives is the responsibility to impact these lives in a manner that is beneficial to our society. Read the 1st paragraph again before you go on.

"ON MY HONOR I WILL DO MY BEST TO DO MY DUTY TO GOD AND MY COUNTRY AND TO OBEY THE SCOUT LAW; TO HELP OTHER PEOPLE AT ALL TIMES; TO KEEP MYSELF PHYSICALLY STRONG, MENTALLY AWAKE, AND MORALLY STRAIGHT."

"A SCOUT IS TRUSTWORTHY, LOYAL, HELPFUL, FRIENDLY, COURTEOUS, KIND, OBEDIENT, CHEERFUL, THRIFTY, BRAVE, CLEAN, AND REVERENT."




