Changes to Cub Scouts for 2024

• Changes will take effect on June 1, 2024.

• Scouts can complete work on their current badge under the old requirements until August 31, 2024.

Brief History of Cub Scouts

- 1924 BSA Executive Board recommends a program for younger boys.
- 1930 "Cubbing" is created as a program separate from Boy Scouts.



Cubbing is based on Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling, a friend of Robert Baden-Powell.

- Initially run by older boys from a Troop.
- Boys could join at age 9.



• 1936 - Den Mothers added. It is the only leadership position a woman could hold in the BSA.

 1945 - Program name changed from Cubbing to Cub Scouting.



• 1949 - Joining age lowered to age 8.

- 1953 First Pinewood Derby was held in California.
- 1954 Webelos Rank introduced for age 10-1/2



- The ranks now consist of Wolf, Bear, Lion and Webelos.
- 1959 Bobcat Award introduced as a metal pin. It is not worn on the uniform!



• 1967 - The original Lion rank is discontinued.

- 1967 Men can become Den Leaders.
- 1976 Women allowed to serve as Cubmasters.



- 1977 new Webelos rank added. Old Webelos requirements become the Arrow of Light.
- 1982 Tiger Cubs introduced as a standalone program not officially part of the Pack.



- 1980's Uniforms updated by designer
 Oscar de le Renta.
- 1990's Tiger Cubs groups integrated into the Pack as Tiger Cub Dens.



• 200 bed uni

- 2004 Tiger Cub Uniforms become the official blue uniform shirt with Orange neckerchief and hat front.
- 2014 The Cub Scout oath and Law of the Pack are dropped in favor of the Scout Oath and Law.



• 2015 - Major changes to program. Adventure loops introduced. Tiger Cubs changes to just Tiger rank.

- 2018 Lion program adopted nationwide after testing in some areas.
- 2018 Girls welcomed to Cub Scouts.



• 2023 - Updates to the whole Cub Scout Program announced to take effect in 2024.



Why the Change?



- Simplify the requirements.
- Be consistent across grades.
- Increase achievement of certain topics like STEM and conservation.



Each rank is associated with a grade.

- Each rank will have six required adventures plus two electives.
- Elective adventures are doubled.



Required adventures:

- Character & Leadership
- Outdoors
- Personal Fitness
- Citizenship
- Safety
- Family and Reverence

2024-2025 Cub Scout Badges of Rank Requirements The Bobcat Adventure is designed to be the first required Adventure.

Each badge of rank is earned by completing six required and two elective Adventures.

The six required Adventures are focused on the aims and focus areas of the BSA.





- Having common required adventures helps facilitate multi-rank Dens.
- Small Packs or Packs struggling to find the right Den leader can have multiple grades working on similar adventures.

Bobcat rank is discontinued

- Each rank will have a
 Bobcat requirement
 relating to Character and
 Leadership.
- Requirement will be tailored to age level.



Bobcat rank is discontinued

When the Bobcat pin was introduced in 1959, Cubs were only age 8 to 11.
One set of requirements was fine.



Bobcat rank is discontinued

-Since Cub Scouts now cover six grades, the values of Scouting mean something very different to a Kindergartener than they do to a fifth grader.

Bobcat Required Adventure Requirements Earned each year, not just once when you first join.

LION - KINDERGARTEN

- 1. Get to know the members of your den.
- Have your adult partner or den leader read the Scout Law to you.
 Demonstrate your understanding of being friendly.
- Share with your adult partner, during a den meeting or at home, a time when you have demonstrated the Cub Scout motto "Do Your Best."
- At home, with your parent or legal guardian do the activities in the booklet "How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide."

BEAR - 3RD GRADE

- 1. Get to know members of your den.
- Recite the Scout Oath and Scout Law with your den and den leader.
- Learn about the Scout Oath. Identify the three points of the Scout Oath.
- With your den Create a Den Code of Conduct.
- Learn about the denner position and responsibilities.
- Demonstrate the Cub Scout sign, Cub Scout salute and Cub Scout handshake. Show how each are used.
- Share with your den, or family, a time when you demonstrated the Cub Scout motto "Do Your Best." Explain why it is important to do your best.
- At home, with your parent or legal guardian do the activities in the booklet "How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide."

ARROW OF LIGHT - 5TH GRADE

- Learn about the patrol method and discuss the benefits.
- 2. Choose a Patrol name and elect a patrol leader.
- Make a patrol flag that includes everyone's name.
- Recite the Scout Oath and Scout Law with your patrol.
- With your patrol develop a Code of Conduct.
- Demonstrate the Scouts BSA sign, salute, and handshake. Show how each is used.
- With your patrol or with your parent/legal guardian visit a Scouts BSA Troop.
- At home, with your parent or legal guardian do the activities in the booklet "How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide."



Should we still do a Bobcat Ceremony?

- Yes! We strongly encourage celebrating the accomplishment.
- This is typically the first adventure earned each year and all Scouts can participate.



Why were STEM awards discontinued?

- As a separate program,
 only about 1.5% of Scouts
 earned them.
- In contrast, about 15%
 earn any given elective
 adventure.


Reimagine Awards to Adventures

Awards have an attachment rate of 1.5% Between 0% and 3%









Elective Adventures have an attachment rate between 15% and 25%

Requirements for all Adventures have been simplified by removing optional requirements such as "Complete requirements 1 and 2 plus at least two others."

Average is 5 requirements.

Updated Code of the Wolf Requirements

- Create a secret code. Send a message to a member of your den or family. Have that person send a message back to you using the same secret code.
- Build and play a game that requires the use of codes or patterns.
- Select a single shape. Observe the environment around you. Write down where you see that shape and how it is being used.
- Using a package that contains a number of different colored items, discover the most common color.



How can Scouts wear all these loops on their belt?


- The intent is that the only loops on the belt be for the rank currently being worked on.



- Loops from previous years can be displayed at home.
- Making a display board could be a great Den activity.



– Paint stir sticks or cheap rulers work well for this!





- Lion blue t-shirt or uniform shirt.
- Tiger/Wolf/Bear/Webelos
 - blue uniform shirt.
- Rank specific hats,
 neckerchief and slide are as before.



- Arrow of Light khaki uniform shirt with blue epaulets.
- There will NOT be a specific Arrow of Light hat, neckerchief or slide.



- One Den Leader patch for adults.
- One blue belt and socks for youth.
- Square Webelos patch is discontinued.



- The Webelos Colors will be renamed the Adventure Colors and will be used by both Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts to display their Adventure pins.

Badges of Rank and Adventures

Current Cub Scouts do not need to change their uniform. Lion – Bear badges of rank position on the uniform is based on the order earned.









 None of this meant is to create a burden on families. If a fourth grader has outgrown their blue shirt, they can purchase a khaki shirt.

ATTENTION! Current 4th grade Webelos



Current 4th grade Webelos should NOT begin work on Arrow of Light.



Current 4th grade Webelos should work on elective Adventures which will not be available next year as an Arrow of Light elective.







Requirements for Scout Badge of Rank May Not Be Worked On Until the Cub Scout Is In A Scouts BSA Troop.
